Dear staff members, students,

One may call it common sense or call it 'self-leadership', as students, lecturers and staff, we all have a responsibility at the College to pay attention to the advice from the national health authorities.

As the Superintendence of Public Health recently stated - "Currently we are experiencing a situation in which we must always aim to improve and do better with the measures being taken. We are seeing a change, however, this will highly depend on the cooperation of the public."
