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## 1. PURPOSE OF DOCUMENT

The purpose of this document is to define the regulations for the: Overall Classification, the Certification and the Individual Grading of Units for MCAST Undergraduate Degree and Master Degree Programmes.

## 2. SCOPE

This document is applicable to all MQF Level 6 and MQF Level 7 programmes at MCAST.

## 3. MQF EQF LEVELS 1 – 6

The following regulations apply to all programmes at Levels spanning from Introductory Level A&B to Level 6 delivered either at Full time or Part time.

### 4.1. Grading of Individual Unit Marks

3.1.1. The total mark for each unit is calculated by summing up all the marks obtained in (all) the assessments for the respective unit.

3.1.2. The total mark of the respective unit is then graded as per table below:

3.1.3. In the case of the MCAST- Northumbria Nursing Degree Programme, the following unit grading applies:

<b>Unit Grades – Only applicable to MCAST-Northumbria Nursing Degree Programme</b>	
40% - 100%	Pass
0% - 39%	Fail

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#### 4.2. Overall Classification Process

- a. The total mark for the programme is calculated by summing up all the marks obtained in (all) the respective Units comprising the qualification.
- b. The final percentage mark achieved by the Student for the programme of study is worked out by calculating the overall average mark achieved in all the units of the programme of study according to the pro-rata weighting of the units according to the number of ECTS of the respective units.
- c. For a Student to successfully complete the programme of study and hence be eligible for certification, the minimum overall mark that needs to be achieved is 50% for each unit within the programme of study, excluding the unit of study that is awarded a Compensatory Pass – (refer to paragraph 12.2)
- d. Candidates who successfully complete the full requirements of a programme of study will be entitled to claim the award / qualification.
- e. Assessment grades/marks obtained from external accredited institutions by students who participate in exchange programmes (such as ERASMUS; etc.) shall be included in the Student's transcript showing that the grades/marks were obtained in transfer. Any such units will, therefore, not be considered in the overall classification of the qualification. In such cases, when working out the classification of a student, the formula used to **determine classification shall be amended to take account of the 'missing' marks as fairly as possible**. This is done in the best interest of the student in order to avoid positive or negative discrimination which can possibly arise due to varying marking practices
- f. Candidates who fail to complete the full requirements of a programme of study shall be issued a transcript of their academic record.

#### 4.3. Overall Classification of Undergraduate Degrees (MQF/EQF Level 6)

- a. For the purpose of final classification, the results of all three or four years of study contribute to the final classification of the programme.
- b. A unit of 6 ECTS is assigned a maximum of 100 marks. The maximum number of marks for units with other workloads (e.g. 3 ECTS, 9ECTS etc.) is calculated pro-rata.
- c. For Bachelor Degree programmes, the assigned marks of the Units in the final year(s) are multiplied by 1.5 times as explained below:

Duration of Programme	Total ECTS	Years for which total of assigned marks is multiplied by 1.5
3 years	180 ECTS	3 <sup>rd</sup> year
4 years	240 ECTS	3 <sup>rd</sup> and 4 <sup>th</sup> year



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- d. Grades/marks for each unit are added towards the final value (total points)
- e. The indicative **overall classification boundaries** are:

First Class	80% or higher
Second Upper	70% to 79%
Second Lower	60% to 69%
Third Class	50% to 59%

- f. The overall classification boundaries can be moderated by the respective Degree Ratification Board depending on the overall performance of the cohort.

#### **4.4 Programme duration, suspension of the programme and mapping of units (RPL)**

The qualifications at MQF Level 6 are to be completed within a maximum specific number of years. Exceptions are allowed subject to a formal, approved request. Students who exceed the programme window can apply for an RPL process to complete the qualification.

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## 5. MQF/EQF LEVEL 7

### 5.1. MQF/EQF Level 7 Awards and Qualifications (60 ECTS taught units + 30 ECTS dissertation\_)

#### 5.1.1 Grading of Individual Unit Marks

In the case of EQF / MQF Level 7 (awards and qualifications) units are graded as 'Pass', 'Merit' and 'Distinction' as per the following grading boundaries:

#### 5.1.2 Overall Grading Process

- The total mark for the programme is calculated by summing up all the marks obtained in (all) the respective Units comprising the qualification.
- The final percentage mark achieved by the Student for the programme of study is worked out by calculating the overall average mark achieved in all the units of the programme of study according to the pro-rata weighting of the units according to the number of ECTS of the respective units.
- For a Student to successfully complete the programme of study and hence be eligible for certification, the minimum overall mark that needs to be achieved is 50% for each unit within the programme of study, excluding the unit of study that is awarded a Compensatory Pass – (refer to paragraph 12.2 in DOC 005 Programme Regulations (MQF EQF Levels 5 - 7))
- Candidates who successfully complete the full requirements of a programme of study will be entitled to claim the award / qualification.
- Assessment grades/marks obtained from external accredited institutions by students who participate in exchange programmes (such as ERASMUS; etc.) shall be included in the Student's transcript showing that the grades/marks were obtained in transfer. Any such units will, therefore, not be considered in the overall classification of the qualification. In such cases, when working out the classification of a student, the formula used to **determine classification shall be amended to take account of the 'missing' marks as fairly as possible**. This is done in the best interest of the student in order to avoid positive or negative discrimination which can possibly arise due to varying marking practices
- Candidates who fail to complete the full requirements of a programme of study shall be issued a transcript of their academic record.

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### 5.1.3 Overall Grading

- a. The ratification of the overall grading of EQF/MQF Level 7 Awards and Qualifications (60 ECTS taught units + 30 ECTS dissertation\_) programmes, falls under the remit of the Degree Ratification Board.

- b. Master's Programmes are graded overall as 'Pass', 'Merit' and 'Distinction' and have the following boundaries:

Unclassified	49% or less
Pass	50% to 64%
Merit	65% to 79%
Distinction	80% and over

- c. Furthermore, a maximum of 100 marks is assigned to every 6 ECTS workload. Hence the overall maximum of 1,500 points is worked out as follows:

<b>Number of Units / ECTS</b>	<b>Points per 6 ECTS</b>	<b>Total</b>
10 units of 6 ECTS	100	1000 points
1 unit of 30 ECTS	100	500 points
Total		1500 points

- d. Thus, the overall classification would be applied to the following point ranges:

Pass	750 to 960 points
Merit	961 to 1185 points
Distinction	1186 points and over

- e. The classification boundaries can be moderated by the respective ratification board depending on the overall performance of the cohort. Further information on the function and the process of the respective ratification boards is available in the document referenced below.

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#### **5.1.4. Programme duration, suspension of the programme and mapping of units (RPL)**

The MQF Level7 programmes (60 ECTS taught units + 30 ECTS dissertation\_) are to be completed within a maximum specific number of years. Exceptions are allowed subject to a formal, approved request. Students who exceed the programme window can apply for an RPL process to complete the qualification.

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## 5.2. MQF/EQF Level 7 Master's by Research Programme 12 ECTS taught units + 78 ECTS dissertation unit

### 5.2.1. Grading of Individual Units

- a) The Units forming part of this qualification are classified as follows:
- 1 Unit: Percentage Mark
  - 1 Unit: Pass or Fail

In the case of units which are graded via a percentage mark, the following table applies:

49% or less	Unclassified

65% to 79%	Merit

### 5.2.2. Overall Grading Process

- a. The total mark for the programme is calculated based on the classification of the Dissertation Unit.
- b. For a Student to successfully complete the programme of study and hence be eligible for certification, the minimum overall mark that needs to be achieved is 50% for each unit within the programme of study, excluding the unit of study that is awarded a Compensatory Pass – (refer to paragraph 12.2)
- c. Candidates who successfully complete the full requirements of a programme of study will be entitled to claim the award / qualification.
- d. Assessment grades/marks obtained from external accredited institutions by students who participate in exchange programmes (such as ERASMUS; etc.) shall be included in the Student's transcript showing that the grades/marks were obtained in transfer.
- e. Candidates who fail to complete the full requirements of a programme of study shall be issued a transcript of their academic record.

### 5.2.3. Overall Grading

- a. The ratification of the overall classification of **Master's by Research** programmes falls under the remit of the Viva board. Details on the composition of the Viva Board and the Viva sessions are available in the document referenced below.

- b. The Overall Grading of Pass, Merit and Distinction, is based solely on the Dissertation Unit.

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#### **5.2.4. Programme duration, suspension of the programme and mapping of units (RPL)**

The Master's by Research Programme (2 ECTS taught units + 78 ECTS dissertation unit) are to be completed within a maximum specific number of years. Exceptions are allowed subject to a formal, approved request. Students who exceed the programme window can apply for an RPL process to complete the qualification.

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### 5.3. MQF/EQF Level 7 Master in Research Methods Programme - with 3 exit points

#### 5.3.1. Programme Structure

Master in Research Methods are comprised of 90 ECTS which are divided as follows:

- PgCert Research Methods (30 ECTS)
- PgDip Research Methods (30 ECTS)
- Master in Research Methods (30 ECTS)

Each 30 ECTS can be claimed as an exit point. Candidates graduate at each 30 ECTS stage. Each Exit point shall be assigned an overall grading and shall be ratified by the DRB as per details in the following sections:

#### 5.3.2. Grading of Individual Units (per exit point)

##### 5.3.2.1. PG CERT

The Units forming part of this qualification are classified as follows:

- 3 Units: Percentage Mark
- 1 Unit: Pass or Fail

In the case of units which are graded via a percentage mark, the following table applies:

The ratification of each exit point falls under the remit of the Degree Ratification Board (DRB). - b. **Master's in Research Methods** Programmes and their exit points (i.e. PG CERT and PG DIP) are classified as 'Pass', 'Merit' and 'Distinction' and have the following boundaries:

Distinction	80% and over

- c. Furthermore, a maximum of 100 marks is assigned to every 6 ECTS workload. Hence the overall maximum points is worked out as follows:

Thus, the overall classification for Master in Research Methods would be applied to the following point ranges:

Pass	700 to 896 points
Merit	897 to 1106 points
Distinction	1107 points and over

#### **5.3.5. Programme duration, suspension of the programme and mapping of units (RPL)**

The Master in Research Methods is to be completed within a maximum specific number of years. Exceptions are allowed subject to a formal, approved request.
